



Hiking Mt. Kilimanjaro

"Located in Tanzania, Mount Kilimanjaro is Africa's tallest mountain at about 5,895 meters (19,340 feet). It is the largest free-standing mountain rise in the world, meaning it is not part of a mountain range. Also called a stratovolcano (a term for a very large volcano made of ash, lava, and rock), Kilimanjaro is made up of three cones: Kibo, Mawenzi, and Shira. Kibo is the summit of the mountain and the tallest of the three volcanic formations." https://education.national geographic.org

Dallas will outline the preparation and training of his trip to Africa to hike this majestic mountain. He will then explore what it took to get to Kilimanjaro and his hike from trailhead to the summit.

North American Monsoon Outlook for Pagosa Springs

Presented by Arleen Prochazka of Pagosa Weather

What are the primary ingredients for the North American monsoon to set up? How does Pagosa Weather determine it will be a weak or strong monsoon? What is the monsoon forecast for Pagosa Springs this summer?

Arleen and Shawn are the National Weather Service (NWS) Archuleta County Weather Ready Nation (WRN) ambassadors. They were recognized by National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) at the national level as 2022 WRN Ambassadors of Excellence. They are also the NWS Community Collaborative Rain, Hail and Snow (CoCoRaHS) network coordinators for Archuleta County. Arleen and Shawn are both members of the American Meteorological Society (AMS) and members of the Pagosa Springs Chamber of Commerce.

Arleen and Shawn were members of Air Force Weather in support of Air Force and Army aviation forces. Arleen for 24 years and Shawn for 20 years, respectively. Their multiple deployments, including Iraq and Afghanistan were the highlight of their careers. Though conditions were harsh, their decisions had significant life or death impacts. Other stations included, Alaska, New York, Colorado, Washington, Germany, Korea and Portugal.
