Benefits to the Community

The Ruby M. Sisson Memorial Library is truly a community hub and provides services, resources, and programs to all people without regard to socioeconomic background, age, race/ethnicity, sex, etc. We are one of downtown's most visited destinations with an average of 6500 visitors each month.

In addition to books and computers, your Ruby M. Sisson Memorial Library is a place where people of all ages gather to explore, share, discover, and dream. We are a warm sanctuary for some and a refuge from loneliness for others. We provide online access to education and employment opportunities, literacy support for children and adults, access to information and life-long learning opportunities that are free of charge for everyone in the community.

Facts and Figures

Total visitors to the Library in 2023 was 72,450, a 20% increase over 2022.

Library staff answered 8200 computer and reference questions in 2023, a 23% increase over 2022.

Community groups reserved the Library's meeting space 458 times in 2023. This number does not include all of the times library staff had to turn groups away due to lack of availability.

In 2023, the staff and volunteers of the Ruby M. Sisson Memorial Library Foundation spent a majority of their fundraising efforts towards the Capital Campaign. Year-end fundraising for general operating support was successfully completed in December.



Accomplishments in 2023

Approximately 85% of the work completed by the staff and volunteers of the Ruby Sisson Library Foundation & Friends was directed towards the *Mountains of Opportunity* capital campaign to expand and renovate the Ruby Sisson Library.

- In April, we hosted our second annual *The Library Affair* and raised nearly \$200,000 from the amazing event.
- In May we hosted true crime author Ron Franscell, and learned about him through an interview with Archuleta County sheriff Mike LeRoux.
- In June, we hosted professional storyteller Kathy Santopietro for *Men for All Seasons in Story*, with musical accompaniment by Sally Neel and her son, Robert.
- In December we hosted our first *Late Night at the Library* Craft night, sponsored by Riff Raff Brewing Company.
- We hosted three Friends of the Library book sales, two at the Ruby Sisson Library, and our large three-day sale at the Community United Methodist Church.
