

Colorado Avalanche Information Center

Know Before You Go (KBYG) is a free avalanche awareness program. Not much science, no warnings to stay out of the mountains, no formulas to memorize. In about an hour, you will see the destructive power of avalanches, understand when and why they happen, and how you can have fun in the mountains and avoid avalanches. Matt began working as a ski patroller at Snowmass in 1996 and quickly moved into a dedicated snow safety position. In 2015, he and his family moved to Idaho. He returned to Colorado and the CAIC in 2018 and currently focuses on highway avalanche safety on the southeast side of the San Juan Mountains. He has spent most of the summer seasons since 1993 working for the US Forest Service in the wildfire program and cursing the heat while waiting for the snow to fall.

Doug has been to Africa on four photographic safaris since 2019. He has visited Kenya, Tanzania, South Africa and Botswana. These trips included the world-renowned Serengeti in Tanzania and the Masai Mara in Kenya, both make famous by many documentaries including, *Nature* on PBS. He will start his presentation with some slides about the Pagosa Springs Photography Club, describe options for traveling to Africa, and then show photos taken from four separate trips.

Doug worked as a software engineer at Los Alamos National Laboratory from 1987 to 2019 and started photography with SLRs, home darkrooms and B&W film about 1970. While attending the University of Arizona in Tucson he worked as a darkroom tech and photographed beautiful landscapes, weddings and college sports.
